Petition of Bhoteah, land-holder of Furrabad  
to the

To The King 'Shield of the World.' May his  
mercy continue!

Your Majesty! This slave is a land-holder of  
Furrabad, and is a laborer by caste. The  
fact he has to submit is that 50,000 Rupees more  
or less belonging to the Government of the East  
India Company are now present in the labor-  
erate revenue office at Calcutta. Some of the  
Ballabgarh Rajah's officials went there; but  
the land-holders of the place did not allow them  
to take possession of the money. - Your slave  
therefore prays that one hundred horsemen and  
fifty Infantry may be sent with him that he  
may bring it away and pay it into the royal  
Treasury. Your well-wishing slave is exerting  
himself solely that he may obtain a subsistence.  
It was necessary and is submitted. - And you  
pursuant of this petition let orders be issued, and  
with the horsemen and Infantry, let a meed of  
conveyance be bestowed on your slave. The petition
