Most Graciously Sheweth, that your Majesty is
aware that before all abominable plots
which are now being active operations, your
Majesty knows likewise that since the arrival
of the Barracks General's engagements
have taken place. - It is necessary to say that
you have proposed to make an attack on

the City - when the above said General
interposed and kept the whole force standing
inactive a long time, wanting to know
