IN reply to your letter of the 4th November 1872, with enclosures, relating to the residence of Feroze Shah, a member of the late Royal family of Delhi at Constantinople, I am instructed by the Duke of Argyll to state, for the information of Lord Granville, that His Grace does not consider it to be expedient to take any measures against the suspected person, unless it should appear that, whilst under the protection of the Porte, he has been engaged in any intrigues, hostile to the British Government in India.
