Letter from the British Moonshee at Cabul,—(dated the 26th September 1864.)

I HAVE heard from a person lately arrived from Herat that Shahzadah Feroze Shah, accompanied by two women and three or four Hindostanee followers, had arrived at Herat. He had lodgings given him in an empty house belonging to a Hindoo; he then sought an interview with Wuzeer Wareem Khan, the Governor of Herat; being disappointed with his reception, he made complaints, which coming to the ear of Wuzeer Wareem Khan, he would not allow him another interview: Feroze Shah in despair took his departure for Bokhara by the way of "Mymunah" with the intention ultimately of finding his way into Russia by Mukeya.

NOTE.—A subsequent report on Feroze Shah's movements included in the diary translated and forwarded yesterday.
