Ferozd Shah who, report said, had escaped through Caudahar, has been captured in the jungle near Ratgurb, not far from the spot where Tautia Topee was betrayed, and the last remnants of his force dispersed. Ratgurb is the scene of the action fought between General Nichol and Tautia Topee, after the latter had looted Jubrapatien. This battle was exceedingly remarkable. Tautia had a park of 27 guns, about 8,000 infantry, and 3,000 cavalry, yet he was defeated by a force of 1,700 or 1,800 British, and lost the whole of his artillery, baggage, &c., without inflicting a single casualty upon his opponents. No other battle in history offers such extraordinary features as this
