CAVALRY.

6th Dragoon Guards—We understand that Col. Jones is about to retire on half-pay, and that the step will go by purchase in the Regiment. The officers to be promoted have all good service.
Colonel Henry Richmond Jones, C.B. (thirty-eight years' full-pay) commanded the Carabineers in the Crimea from Aug. 14, 1855, including the battle of the Tchernaya, siege and fall of Sebastopol (medal and clasp, 5th Class of the Medjidie, and Turkish medal). Served in the Indian campaign; commanded General Penny's column in the action of Kirkrowlie, that officer having been killed by the first shot fired by the enemy, and captured a gun; commanded a Brigade of Cavalry at the capture of Bareilly; commanded the left column with Lord Clyde's Force in the attack on Benhi Maidho's Force at Dunderkera; commanded the Cavalry with Lord Clyde's Force in the Trans-Gogra campaign, including affairs at Magedia Chundal, and Banke, also pursuit of the rebels to the Raptee (C.B., medal).
Brevet Lieutenant-Colonel and Major Charles Sawyer (twenty-nine years' full-pay) served in the Crimea from May 26, 1855, including the battle of the Tchernaya, siege and fall of Sebastopol (medal and clasp, and Turkish medal). Served also in India during the whole of the mutiny; present at the actions of Busgoon, Mohudapore, Russulpore, attack and capture of Mitowlee, actions of Alligunge and Biswa, and subsequent pursuit of Tantia Topce and Feroze Shah in Central India (medal and Brevet of Lieutenant-Colonel).
Brevet-Major and Captain Thomas Bott (twenty years' full-pay service) served in the Crimea from July 1855, and was present at the battle of the Tchernaya, siege and fall of Sebastopol, afterwards accompanied the Light Cavalry Brigade to Eupatoria, and present during the operations there under General D'Allonville (medal and clasp, and Turkish medal). Served throughout the Indian Mutiny from the outbreak at Meerut in May 1857; commanded the Cavalry with Sir John Jones' column through Rohilcund, which included battles of Nugeera (Brevet of Major), relief of Moradabad, and action on the Dojoura; commanded a squadron of the Carabineers, two guns of Bengal Artillery, and two Native Infantry Regiments at the taking of Bareilly; present at the attack and bombardment of Shahjehanpore, defeat of the rebels, and relief of the garrison; also the subsequent affairs when the place was three different times attacked by the Moulvie; capture of the Bunnal fort, and pursuit of the Sepoys to the left bank of the Goomtee, destruction of the fort of Mahumdee, action of Bunkagaon; campaign in Oude, including actions of Pusgaon, Mohudapore, Rusulpore, attack and capture of Fort Mitowlee, action of Alligunge; commanded a squadron of Carabineers on the forced march and taking of Ismail Khan's nine guns, which compelled his surrender immediately afterwards; also present at the engagement at Biswa (medal, and frequently mentioned in despatches).
Lieutenant James John Neil Buchanan (ten years' full-pay service) served with the 10th Hussars in the Crimean campaign from April 17, 1855, including the siege and fall of Sebastopol, battle of the Tchernaya, and affair of Sept. 21 near Kertch (medal and clasp, and Turkish medal). Served with the 6th Dragoon Guards throughout the Indian campaign of 1857-59, including operations in Rohilcund and action of Nugeera, relief of Bareilly, relief of Shahjehanpore, capture of the fort of Remai and pursuit with destruction of the fort of Mahumdee, action of Bunkagaon, operations in Oude and actions of Mohudipore and Rusulpore, attack and capture of Fort Mitowlee, actions of Alligun and Biswa. Also served as officiating D. Q.-M.-G. to the Agra Field Force under Brigadier Showers in Central India in pursuit of Tantia Topce, Feroze Shah, and others (medal).
8th Hussars—Capt and Brev-Maj Samuel Hill Lawrence, V.C., who has exchanged from 25th Foot to this Reg. (15 years in the Army), served with the 32nd Reg. in the Punjab campaign of 1848-49, including the second siege operations before Mooltan, including the storm and capture of the city, and surrender of the fortress; also at the surrender of the fort and garrison of Cheniote, and battle of Goojerat (medal and clasps); served during the Indian mutiny in 1857-58; commanded the head-quarters 32nd Reg. at the evacuation of Fort Muchee Bhawan on July 1, 1857, and from that date was engaged in the defence of the Residency of Lucknow until its final relief on Nov. 24 by Lord Clyde, during the greater part of which he commanded the Redan battery; led a sortie on July 7 and a division of another on Sept. 26, where his company captured a 9-pounder gun at the point of the bayonet—mentioned in Despatches by Sir John Inglis and the Governor-General, and received the Victoria Cross (Brevet of Major, medal and clasp, and a year's service for Lucknow).
ORDNANCE.
ROYAL ARTILLERY.
Lieutenant Phipps, Instructor of Gunnery to the 1st Division of the Depot Brigade, Rl Artillery, has arranged, with the sanction of the authorities, to deliver a series of lectures to the officers and men of the Brigade during the approaching winter on the science of gunnery. The course of lectures will combine practical with theoretical information regarding the method of preparing and firing fuzes, the composition of the various sorts of gunpowder, and the construction of the different kinds of projectiles, including the improved shrapnel, and common and diaphragm shells, solid, conical, and round shot, and the initial velocity of each fired with varying charges of powder from both smooth-bored and rifled ordnance of
