

Sir Hugh Rose, K.C.B.; was present at the capture of Rhatghus, 28th January; action of Baroda, 31st January; relief of Saugor, 3rd February; capture of Ganaetta, 12th February; forcing Muddenpore Pass, 3rd March; battle of the Bitwa, 1st April; storm and capture of Jhansi, 3rd April; action of Koonch, 7th May; battle of Gowlowlee, 22nd May; advance and capture of Calpee and pursuit of the rebels, 23rd May; capture of Movar Cantonments, 16th June; recapture of the town and fortress of Gwalior, 19th June, 1858. He also served in the Gwalior Division, in '58, under the command of Brigadier General Sir R. Napier, K.C.B., in the pursuit of the rebels under Feroz Shah and the action of Ranode, 17th December, 1858. Frederick, the brother of this gallant man, died abroad, he being also in the army; and a letter from the Secretary to the Duke of Wellington stated that he was much beloved in his regiment, and was buried with military honors.
