One of the earliest visitors was his Royal Highness the Prince of Wales, who arrived about eight o'clock. He was received by Sir W. Of other schools, there were Brixton Christ Church, sent by the Rev. J. Hussey, 59; Wanstead Orphan Asylum, sent by the governors, 36; Ealing Christ Church (subscription at church doors), 15; Jews' Free School, Spitalfields, franked by Mr. H. Emanuel, 14; British Orphan Asylum, Clapham Rise (by directors), 32. Messrs. Hollingsworth and Co., of Maidstone, purchased 400 half-crown tickets for their workpeople, the object being—and a most commendable one it was—that the latter might come on a day when there would be room for them to see and examine everything. "An Englishman named Rudd has been sentenced to be hanged at Calcutta for shooting a native in the Punjab. Except an Irish soldier, who was hanged in 1858 for shooting a comrade, this will be the first instance of a European being executed in Calcutta since it became a British possession. A petition has been presented for the man's reprieve.
