I am directed to report for the orders of the Government of India a case in which it appears to the Lieutenant Governor to be desirable to allow a compassionate pension.

2. Buland Bakht Mirza, a political pensioner of the ex-royal family of Delhi drawing a monthly pension of Rs 28-15-3 died on the 19th May 1909, leaving four sons and two daughters as named below.

- (1) Firoz Shah, son, aged 50 years.
- (2) Mandi Shah " " 45 "
- (3) Gauhar Shah " " 40 "
- (4) Sultan Mirza " " 35 "
- (5) Sultan Zamani Begam, daughter aged ----- 30 "
- (6) Malka Zamani Begam, daughter aged ----- 18 "

The deceased being in the third succession from Mirza Sikandar Shikoh, the grantee of the original pension of

Rs 1,000/-, no portion of his pension is available under the rules for continuance to his heirs.


3. It appears from enquiries made by the local officers that all the deceased's four sons are badly off, but the only one in whose case the Commissioner of Lucknow has considered it necessary to make any recommendation is the eldest, Firoz Shah. He is an old man, has no means whatever, and has five children largely dependant on him.

4. As regards the other members of the family, the second and third sons have not been heard of in Lucknow for some years, and do not seem to have any claim on the Government. The fourth has a small wasika and is not too old to earn a living. The two daughters are married. In these circumstances the Lieutenant Governor accepts the recommendation of the Commissioner of Lucknow and solicits the sanction, as a special case, of the grant to Firoz Shah of a compassionate allowance of Rs 10/- a month for his life.
