Copy of a letter No 570, dated 21st October
1852, from Secretary to Government Punjab, to
the Secretary to Government of India, Foreign
Department, Calcutta. -

I am directed to Submit for the Orders
of the Supreme Government an Original petition
from Amiza Shahaooden of the Delhi Royal
Family (received through the Governor General's
agent at Parnass) praying for the restoration
of the pensions enjoyed by certain of his female
Wife Begum - Mother } relatives, as per margin,
Akhubtounissa Begum } prior to the Meeting
Grand Mother - } of 1857. -
Habibunnessa Begum }
Sister. - } 2

It has been
ascertained from the Commissioner of Delhi that
Akhubtounissa Begum was in receipt of
a pension of Rupees 256. 11. 0 per annum, and
Habibunnessa Begum a pension of Rs 133. 5. 0,
per annum; but that there is nothing to show
that Wife Begum received any allowance.
The dates of last payment, cannot be ascertain-
ed; but the pensions have been suspended
since May 1857. -

3. Beyond the fact that these ladies
were in the City of Delhi, during the Siege, there
is nothing against them. In similar cases
pensions have been restored at half the
former amounts; and this course the Honble
the Lieutenant Governor now recommends
with assent, as in previous cases, from 1st May
1857. -

Extract from a letter No 114, dated 15th
July 1862, from the Under Secretary to the
Government of India, Foreign Department,
with the Governor General, Simla, to the
Secretary to the Government of the Punjab.

Para. 4. With reference to the Cases,
now more immediately under Consideration,
I am to observe that as it is now reported
that the Punjab Government did not
intend to make any provision for Hajra
Begum and that she is not shown
to be destitute, His Excellency the Viceroy
and Governor General does not see the
necessity of conferring a pension on her.

5. In regard to the other two ladies,
Mrs. Mohabutoonissa and Kadii Zumanee,
His Excellency is pleased to sanction the
grant to them of the pensions recommended;
viz. to the former a pension of Rs. 133.5.0.
per Annum, and to the latter a pension
of Rupees 66.10.0. per Annum.
