Order under the Seal of the royal Court of
Justice to the Chief Police Officer of Berlin
Dated 22nd July 1837.

To The Emblem of Valour - Chief Police
Officer of Berlin.

The prisoners sent by you have reached this
Court. The files of papers relating to the cases
of two of these prisoners as specified below are pre-
sent in this Office; but those of the other three
prisoners are not forthcoming. If you have
any receipt of this royal Court on account of
the three missing files in your possession you
are directed to submit it. And for the future
it is necessary that all prisoners who are for-
warded to this Court should be accompanied
by the usual form of committals; and by the
plaintiff and the proofs of guilt in the cases.
And it is directed that all the subordinate
Police Officers may be authorized to send the
usual form of committals with all prisoners
in the same way.

ring honor - to the effect, that 5 prisoners in-
detained from the Chief Police Station of the City

had reached and that in reference ^{10/4} to these
the files of the cases of Govind and Ram
were in the office of the royal court
of justice; but that those of Chandok, Ch.
Lam Allen and Thora Bahli have not been
found, and requesting that if any receipt of the
royal Court is forthcoming it be submitted,
and further enjoining that in future cases of
the usual form of commitment, the plaintiff, and
the proofs of guilt, be sent with the prisoner. has

It is further submitted that search having
been made in the Office of this Police Station
no receipt of the royal Court, on account of
the papers in this case, could be found. This
is a point that frequently when papers are for-
warded no receipt is given from the Office of
the royal Court; and it is accordingly a matter
of helplessness, such as the particulars were.
They are submitted. For the future great care
will be observed in this matter; and when a pri-
soner is forwarded, the form of commitment, the
plaintiff, and the proofs of guilt will be sent
at the same time. All the subordinate Police

with these orders; and will carefully conform to
