From—The Chief Secretary to the Government Burma,

To—The Secretary to the Government of India, Home Department.

*Clear the line.*—The Inspector General of Police, Rangoon, telegraphs that there is a rumour current in Rangoon that Indian Troops in the Punjab have mutinied. Should like an authoritative contradiction but all precautions taken to deal with possible effect of rumour.

Telegram no. 612, dated Simla, the 19th April 1919.

From—The Secretary to the Government of India, Home Department,

To—The Chief Secretary to the Government of Burma, Maymyo.

*Clear the line.*—Rumour that Indian troops in the Punjab have mutinied entirely false and without foundation. Indian troops in the Punjab and elsewhere absolutely staunch and being utilized to quell disturbances in disorderly areas. This should be made public.

This is with reference to your telegram no. 100-C.W. of the 18th instant.
