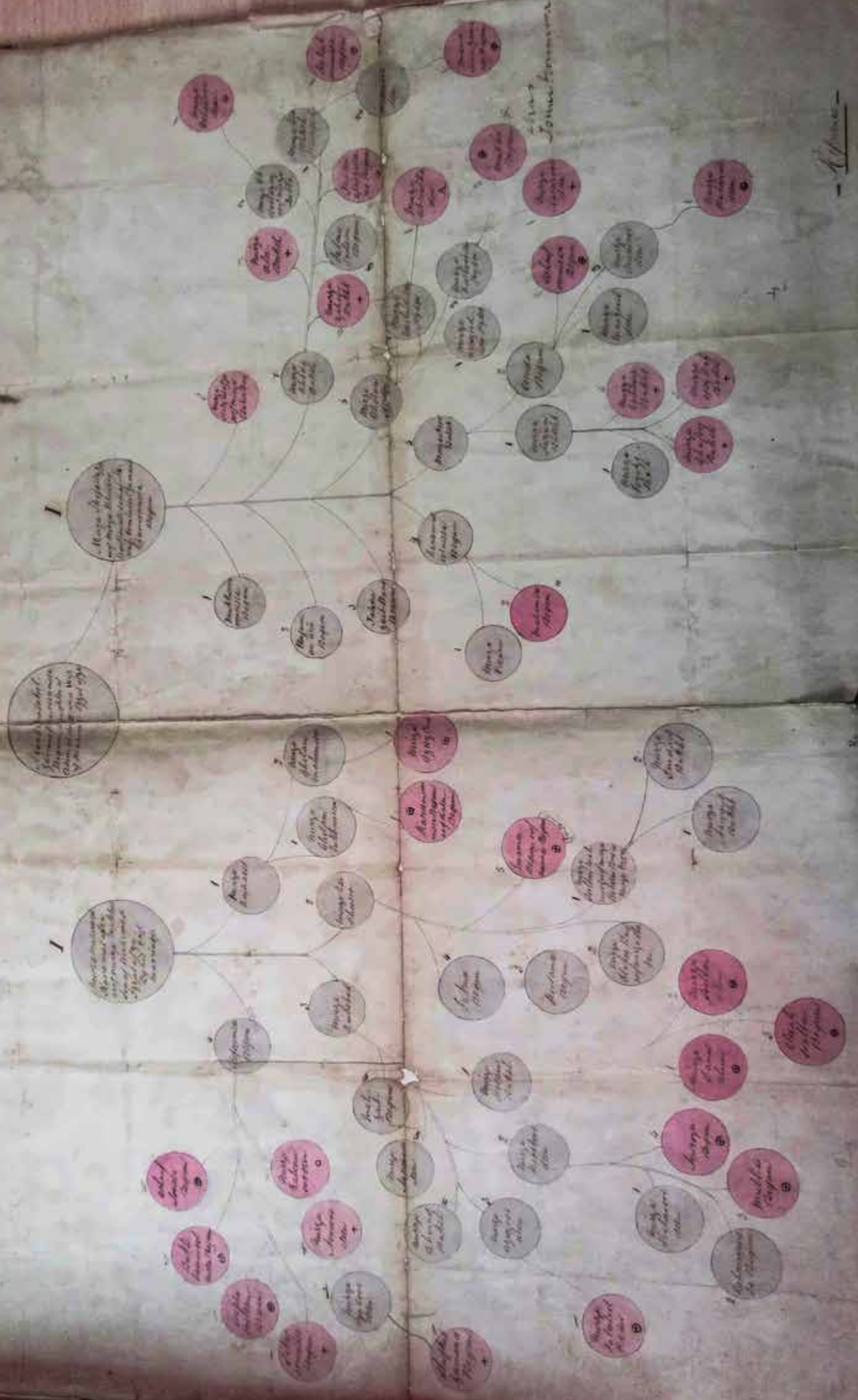

Sir. In reply to your No 7 of 10th January and Financial Commissioner's No of 2^d January 1855. I have the honor to forward a Genealogical Tree and letters in vernacular from Mirza Allah Bakh, giving a statement showing the distribution of the prison of Rupees 5000 at the time of the mutiny in 1857

1. The money was according to this statement divided as follows

2. The last named is the man who was hanged on the capture of Delhi, information as to amount of whose share is asked for in para 9 of Financial Commissioner's letters in my reply.

3. The Mirza is unable to give any detail

detail of the distribution of the 30000.9
It was within his own power; he gave to
whom he liked and as he liked.

6. He considers that, on the death
of the three Co. Sharees, enumerated, these
Shares lapsed to himself. And states that
Mr. Barboill recommended that the whole
Sum should be continued to him.
He holds that as the praction was in view of

7. He considers that the descendants
of a Hindu Comdant of the name Begun
(said plural name) had no claim

Comendador Alonzo Piquero receives
a pension of Papeles 1750 7/4 per
Annum for life, being one of the 10
pensions, amounting to Papeles 22,000 7/0
per Annum sanctioned by Governor
General under paras 1, 2 and 3 of Supreme
Govt. No 5204 dated 20th August 1859
to Secretary Government Papeles.
She is entered in the Statement attached
to Grants to Alonzo Piquero and the same
date numbers of his family as his daughter
but it appears that she is only an adopted
daughter.

9. I find that 19 of the documents of
Comendador Alonzo Piquero, entered in
the Genealogical tree are in receipt of
Papeles 10 per Annum being included
in the 76 volumes sanctioned by Govt
in paras 1, 2 & 3 of Supreme Government's letter
above quoted.

10. Pensions were also granted
by Government in the same letter to 10 of
the

the immediate relations of Mirza
Ilahee Begum according to Papers 2002 p. b.
for Curcum. With the exception of the Lady
alluded to in para 8, they do not ap-
pear in the genealogical tree, as none
of the somewhat descendants of the
Mirza are ^{known} years. I annex a detail
of the pensions alluded to

11. Sharfuzza Begum wife of Akbar
Saad Khan Begum (No. 4 out of the 10 members
of Ilahee Begum's family) figures in the genea-
logical tree as Mahommed Begum.
Which Saad Khan Begum is said to be her
real name the other names are acquired
ones.

12. In addition to the above, 9
men and women who appear in the ge-
nealogical tree receive each a pension
of Rs 50 per mensem being amongst
the pensions sanctioned by Government
in Government letter 1160, 26th Sept 1866. Perhaps
Ans 006 of 14 Feb 1865

13. Not only of the living mem-
bers of the family who figure in the genea-
logical tree, are without pensions from
Government, but because he receives

resides at Rampart and remains
in prison from the start but one he
could be was absent from Dublin when
the roll of prisoners was prepared.

14. The share of *Barry* *alle King*
who was hanged as a rebel is I think
justly liable to redemption and compensa-
tion, but I do not see that we can go
into the question whether *Barry* *alle King*
is entitled to the whole of the residue
of the 5000 Purses per Annum, or whether
the other living heirs of *Montreal Eugene*
des Regum are entitled to a portion.

15. The prison was given in lieu of
landed property and its distribution
must follow the ordinary law of in-
heritance. It is not for us to put up
the heirs of *Montreal Eugene des Regum*
to accept claims under that law. They
must be allowed to be the judges of
their own interests.

16. It is of course quite another
and distinct question whether any of
the
