possession of the King are his

heirs shall lapse to the King. That the
holder of an estate is at liberty to make over
the estate to Govt. receiving an annual

Cash payment in lieu and on the death
of such person the annual payment will
be made to the King.

her life, and consequently on the Begum's demise
the estate lapsed to her grand-daughter (Feroz Bukht's
daughter) Kossujahan Begum mother-in-law of
Mirza Illakee Bukhsh - and on the death of the
latter the estate fell on Kossince Begum wife
of Mirza Illakee Bukhsh - who inherited it to her
