With reference to the orders of Govt. in the case of Mirza Akbar Baksh and Entry No 3^d of the Statement which accompanied my predecessors letter No 198 of 13 June 1859 to the Govt.

* Annual pious in lieu of the process of the jagher of Akbarabak and Sampla territories by myself & family through the agent of Delhi

I have the honor to state the specific sanction of Govt. applied for by the Dy Commr Delhi to the money payment of Rs 500 of to Mirza Akbar Baksh from the General Revenue portion of the assignment enjoyed by him from the Mool Villages of Akbarabak and Sampla. These Villages were not correctly speaking held in Jagher

by the Merzas as the pecunies arrived
from them was in the first instance
remitted to the Agent to the Sub. Gov.
at Delhi who after paying the amount
in the Treasury gave orders in favor of
the several parties entitled to assignments
from the same. These villages are in
the Rohilkhand Dist. in the Aijmer Division
and as the Merzas interest in them entitles
to a share only of the proceeds, I consider
that the allowance should now be treated
as a pension in lieu of a resumed maqfa.
It is beyond doubt that the Merza
had an income of Rs 5000 a year
My Office Treasurers books prove that
he was paid regularly since 1847 from

the late Treasury the matter was fully
investigated by Mr. Saunders before he
submitted his report regarding the same,
also by Mr. Egerton before he advocated
the continuance of the allowance.

3rd The following is the history of the case.
The Villages of Asandah, Simpla, Mutha,
Mheroo, Gurhee and Nayab as in the
Northwest Dist. yielding a sum of about
Rs 17000 a year appertaining to the
Privileges or Crown Lands of the Service
of Simoor, some part of this sum
yearly part they were assigned
for the maintenance of Queen
Jahannara Begum daughter of
Shah Jahan and continued in

the possession of her Ancestors till
the demise of Mirza Kabeer Durr's
grand father about the beginning
of the present Century when the grant
was resumed by the Crown and an
allowance of Rs 500 of a year made
in the stead to Mirza Khutchoo father
of the Mirza from the Royal Treasury this
was continued to the Mirza (Elakubuse)
on his fathers death which occurred
about 77 years ago, and was drawn
by him from the Royal Treasury till the
year 1847 when the Management of the
Sawal lands devolved on the Agent
at Delhi, and the Mirza availed
of the opportunity to take the

income derived from them with
the payment of this and sundry other
amounts which were disbursed
regularly up to the time of the outbreak
of 1857. The Mirza has no claim
to any other Jagheer besides the above,
his remaining claim is for the pro-
prietary rights in 5 Villages, some
of which are situated in the
Mierut District. The Government
has not yet communicated the
circumstances of these villages
as to whether or not there is any
difficulty in restoring them to the
Mirza. He has been again advised
